



As the official publication of the Ohio Environmental Health Association the OJEH is committed to delivering key information to membership as well as publishing promising practices and interesting projects. Articles obtained for the OJEH come directly from members or those interested in environmental health. If you have an article please consider submitting it for publication!

Article submission deadlines are:

- February 15 for the 1st quarter
- May 15 for the 2nd quarter
- August 15 for the 3rd quarter, and
- November 15 for the 4th quarter.

Article submissions are in several categories including: the presidents message, the featured District Director's message, legislative updates, partner agency updates (ODH, ODA, OEPA), OEHA committee reports, and general submissions. This final category is open for submissions from anyone who has an article that advances environmental public health. This could include a CQI project completed at your agency, an interesting project or study you recently completed, or any other article that would be of benefit to the association and the State.

The committee makes a great attempt to ensure your article is printed in the way you intend, but at times some formatting adjustments need to be made to keep the flow of the journal. Articles are formatted in Times New Roman 11 pt font in two columns with 0.5" separation and 0.75" outer margins. Also, please turn off auto hyphenation. To ensure your article is published in your vision, please submit articles using these specifications in Microsoft word or publisher 2007 or newer.



Membership Renewal

First, on behalf of the Ohio Environmental Health Association, I would like to thank you for your continued support of the Association by renewing your membership.

Secondly, The Board of Directors would like to make you aware of a few changes to our membership renewal process. Moving forward, OEHA will no longer be mailing membership renewal notices. Instead, we will be emailing all notices via our online member notification tool.

You can either renew your membership online via credit card, or mail in a completed membership application along with proper payment.

<u>Online Payments.</u> For members who wish to utilize online payment via credit card, you will need to first login into your OEHA account on our website (www.ohioeha.org). From there, you will be able to click on the "Pay My Dues by Credit Card" button located on the left side of the page.

You will then be taken to a secure section of the site to input the necessary credit card information. You will then immediately receive a confirmation notice that your dues have been renewed. If you choose to renew online, there will be an additional processing fee.

<u>To Pay by Check</u>. For members who wish to mail a check, you will either need to submit a paper application (see below) or need to first login into your OEHA account on our website (www.ohioeha.org). From there, you will be able to click on the "Pay My Dues by Check" button located on the left side of the page. This process allows you to update your membership and contact information and creates an invoice in our system. Once the check is received, we process your check and then finalize your membership renewal.
